Administration of Medication During School Hours

The Board of Education shall not be responsible for the diagnosis and treatment of student illness. The administration of prescribed oral medication should be avoided, but will be permitted when failure to take such medication would jeopardize the health of the student or the student would not be able to attend school if the medicine were not administered during school hours. Medication will be administered only after the following conditions have been met:

- 1. A written request must be completed and returned to the school nurse by the prescribing physician detailing the name of the medication, diagnosis, dosage, form, time of administration, duration of treatment, side effects and ramifications of failure to medicate(complete section I of form: Physician's Authorization).
- A written request must be completed by the parent/guardian and returned to the school nurse for the administration of medication of medication that are authorized by the physician (complete section III of form: Parent/Guardian Authorization); relieving the Board of Education and its employees of liability for administration of medication.
- 3. Permission may be granted to a student for self-administration of medication for asthma or other potentially life-threatening illnesses (i.e. inhalers, epipens, glucagon etc.) provided the Parent/Guardian and Physician's Authorizations are completed including written certification regarding the student's condition and that the student is capable and has been instructed in self-administration of the medication (complete section II of form: Physician's Authorization).
- 4. The district shall incur no liability as a result of an injury arising from the seladministration of medication by the student.
- 5. The medication must be brought to the school nurse in a container properly labeled with the physician's name, child's name, drug, dose schedule by prescribing physician or pharmacy. The nurse may verify prescribed medication with the physician.
- 6. Absolutely **NO** <u>over the counter</u> medications (i.e. Tylenol, Advil etc) will be administered in school unless ordered by a physician and accompanied by the completed sections of the form (**complete section I and III of form and** <u>send in the medication</u>).
- 7. The school Physician will review the medication orders of the private physician.
