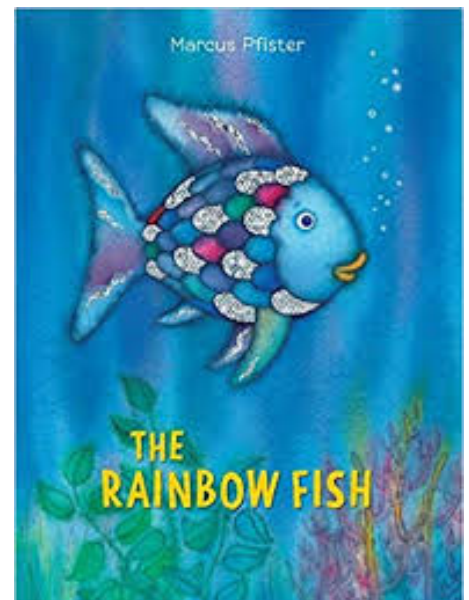

- At CRS have your kindergarteners and first graders open their own doors and exit the cars.
- Do not cut the line as it can cause an accident when someone else in the line is pulling away.
- Please do not have conversations with your child while driving up or pulling away as this too can cause an accident.
- Do not block or make U-turns in our neighbors' driveways. This is their neighborhood too and we need to respect that.
- Remain in the car at all times. At CRS we will help the Preschoolers exit the cars and get the kindergarteners and first graders back in at the end of the day.
- Please remind your children to walk carefully as the leaves will start falling and they can become slippery.

Your attention is vital in helping to create a safer and smoother car line.
