

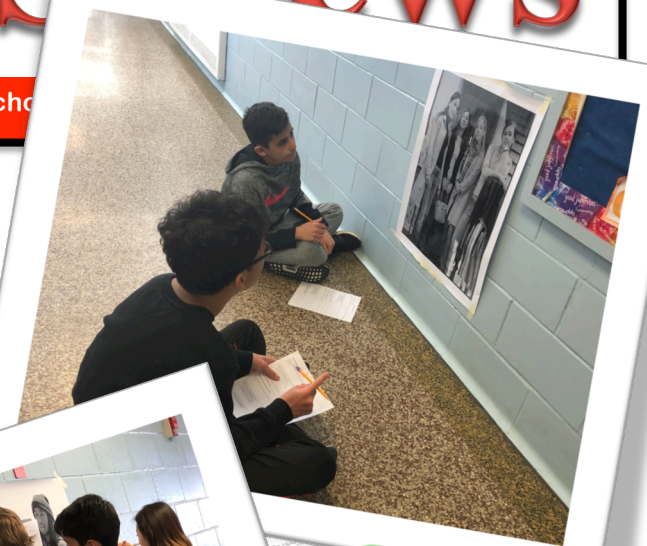

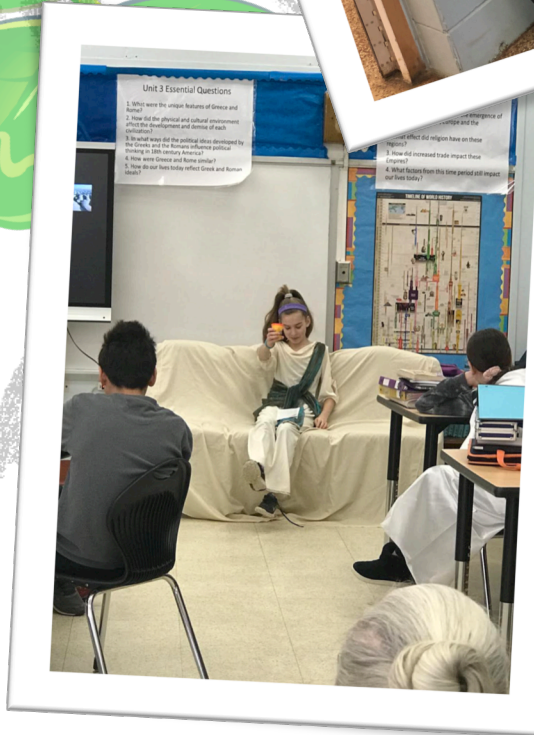
7th Grade Gallery Walk
