# **MINUTES - REGULAR MEETING**

October 26th, 2010

## I. OPENING

- A. The meeting was called to order at 8:06 p.m.
- B. Board President's Announcement:

The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

#### II. BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Holzberg commented on the board's attendance at the NJSBA Conference. Members attended mandatory and other programs. Attendees were frustrated waiting for buses and needing tickets to attend various venues.

#### III. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Fox stated that NJASA has strong feelings on the NJSBA Conference returning to Atlantic City. Most of the new Smart Boards are being installed and the FM systems were previously installed. We are doing turn key training with a strong push for infusion of technology. L. Meyer and B. Price visited the district to help integrate technology into World Language. Mr. Fox spoke about the Dan Reinke story, a former student. He updated the board on our soccer team and reviewed a recent accident where a Haworth resident fell off the Demarest Middle School bleachers and was taken to the hospital. We continue to work on updating our website.

Mr. Kirkby spoke about the upcoming Halloween Parades and the historical field trip around Demarest with Mary Ann Clark. We held the Child Assault Prevention Program "No More Bully's – No more Tears." Susan Thompson presented a program on Immigration – Creative Dance from different Countries. October is Fire Safety Month. We are continuing our Electronic Report Card training.

Mr. Lombardy shares a booklet detailing the 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Buehler Center trip. The Media Center celebrated Banned Book Week which included text of The Lorax, Charlotte's Web and Harry Potter. Former student Dan Reinke worked with Demarest Middle School physical education teachers to create a unit of study called "Stepping Into Someone Else's Shoes." that addresses the difficulties those with disabilities experience on a daily basis. New York Times best-selling author Scott Westerfield spoke to the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade students about his new books, his craft and signed books.
